

# THE KUTUMB FOUNDATION ANNUAL REPORT 2012-2013

**PART TWO** 







### PRELIMINARY NEED ASSESSMENT FINDINGS

Our Need Assessment was conducted over a three week period and utilised community members and volunteers to carry out the interviews. Our survey sample was a purposive sample. This Need Assessment is the first of monthly community meetings with the families of our participants; these discussions will address a wide range of community issues and will inform the scope and focus of Kutumb's work.

In Savda-Ghevra we surveyed 13 families. The average monthly income from our survey sample was Rs. 3,700 per month. The average family size of our survey applicants was a little over 5 individuals per family. Almost 54% of the mothers we surveyed never attended school, while this was only true for 23% of the fathers. 54% of male breadwinners were daily labourers, while 100% of mothers identified themselves as housewives. Of the 42 children in our survey sample, only 1 child attended tuitions (paid and non-paid). 3 of the 42 children had dropped out of school. All the surveyed children attended Hindi medium government schools.

In Sunder Nursery Basti, Nizamuddin, we surveyed 13 families. The average monthly income from our survey sample was Rs. 5,300 per month. The average family size of our survey applicants was 5.5 individuals per family. Almost 54% of the mothers we surveyed never attended school, while this was only true for 31% of the fathers. 23% of male breadwinners were drivers, 15% were daily labourers and 15% were tailors. 23% of mothers identified themselves as employed (1 tailor and 2 domestic servants) while the rest identified as housewives. Of the 45 children in our survey sample, 22 children attended tuitions; of these 22 children, 6 attended paid tuitions. 6 of the 45 children had dropped out of school, but two (both young girls) returned to school within one year. 2 of the 45 children attended English medium schools.

In the Khan Market Servants' Quarters we surveyed 20 families. The average monthly income from our survey sample was Rs. 6,600 per month. The average family size of our survey applicants was 5.2 individuals per family. 35% of the mothers we surveyed never attended school, while this was only true for 10% of the fathers. 25% of male breadwinners were security guards. 75% of mothers identified themselves as employed (65% as domestic servants), although this employment is without pay, as it is part of the package for living in the servants' quarters. Of the 64 children in our survey sample, 13 children attended tuitions; of these 13 children, 5 attended paid tuitions. 2 of the 64 children had dropped out of school, but one returned to school within one year. 2 of the 64 children attended private schools.
